Exercising the authority granted by Governor Gavin Newsom's Executive Order N-38-20, the March 30, 2020 and April 29, 2020 Statewide Emergency Orders of Chief Justice Tani Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the California Judicial Council, and the June 10, 2020 Order of Chief Justice Tani Cantil-Sakauye issued in response to the June 5, 2020 Request for a Judicial Emergency Order made by the Superior Court or Orange County ("Court"), and in addition to the measures the Court instituted in its May 26, 2020 Amended Fourth Implementation Order, this Court HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS THE FOLLOWING ADDITIONAL MEASURES:

1. The Court extends the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than 30 days in cases in which the original or previously extended statutory deadline otherwise would expire from 6/16/2020 to 8/7/2020, inclusive. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(10).)

It is the intent of this Order to provide the maximum length of constitutionally permitted continuance days authorized by the March 30, 2020 and April 29, 2020 Statewide Emergency Orders issued by the Hon. Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chief Justice of the California Supreme Court and by the June 10, 2020 Order of Chief Justice Tani Cantil-Sakauye issued in response to the June 5, 2020 Request for a Judicial Emergency Order made by the Court. Any conflicts in the above language are to be resolved in favor of granting the lengthier of the continuance options. To the extent that any provision of this Supplemental Order conflicts with any provision in the Court's Fourth Implementation Order, this Supplemental Order will supersede the provisions of this Court's May 26, 2020 Amended Fourth Implementation Order.

THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.
